Policy Statement

N.B: This is an example of how a Club policy might be laid out. The exact content and level of detail should reflect the Club's own requirements and practices. All those working with young people should have access to the British Water Ski & Wakeboard (BWSW) 'One Voice' Safeguarding Policy.

It is	s the policy of (Club/Organisation) to:	
•	Accept the moral and legal responsibility to implement procedures to provide a duty of care for young people, safeguard their wellbeing and protect them from abuse	
•	Respect and promote the rights, wishes and feelings of young people	
•	Recruit, train and supervise their employees and volunteers so as to adopt best practice to safeguard are protect young people from abuse, and themselves against allegations	
•	Require staff and volunteers to adopt and abide by the <i>BWSW 'One Voice' Safeguarding Policy</i> which incorporate the British Water Ski & Wakeboard Code of Ethics and Behaviour	
•	Respond to any complaints about poor practice or allegations of abuse for the purpose of this policy anyone under the age of 18 should be considered as a child and all Club members should be aware of this policy.

enł	those with significant access to or responsibility for young people will be required to complete an nanced level DBS. All DBS checks must be applied for through BWSW unless the individual has signed up to Updating Service.

pra	members of (Club/Organisation) should follow the good ctice guidelines attached to this policy. Those working with young people need to be aware of the dance on recognising abuse.

	Photographs and Recorded Images' template) from the young person and their parents/carers before ing photographs or video at an event or training session or publishing such images.	
pho	rents and spectators should be prepared to identify themselves if requested and state their purpose for otography/filming. If (Club/Organisation) publishes images of ung people, no identifying information will be included.	
	y concerns about inappropriate or intrusive photography or the inappropriate use of images should be orted to the Club Welfare Officer immediately.
